


Hello from Regina, Saskatchewan.

Precision medicine in breast cancer now is important because breast cancer is no longer a single disease.

Your medical treatment is now based on characteristics of your tumor. We call this precision medicine.

Your Radiologist finds the cancer by imaging, provides the tissue by core biopsy, and stages the breast by MRI, which sometimes requires more biopsy work.

Your breast pathologist, using this tissue, makes the diagnosis, and by using special protein stains, the location of this protein staining in the cell, provides information on what treatment is right for your particular tumor.

Requirement:

Early diagnosis: yearly mammogram beginning age 40, (sometimes sooner depending on history). Your breast cancer imaging specialist requires high quality mammography and sometimes ultrasound.

Work with your technologist. Your Radiologist is only as good as the images we receive. Mammograms show "Black and White." The breast must be compressed. The blind spots (armpit area, around the nipple and along the bottom of your breast) must be included on yearly mammograms.

Please help your technologist help us help you.

Chemoprevention/ Estrogen Blockers

Introduction to Upcoming Live CME Annual Conference.

A major public health focus is the prevention of breast cancer.

Breast cancer is the most common female cancer in all ethnic groups.

Although this is a treatable breast cancer and survival is good and has improved, the challenges to patients, families and caretakers managing breast cancer are significant.

"An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure."

Most breast cancers are fed by a natural hormone, estrogen.

Clinical trials begun in the 1980's have shown that four medications, which block estrogen and limit the development of breast cancer in higher RISK groups by 50%.

Criteria for taking such meds are reviewed with a Medical Oncologist and based on patient and family medicine issues.

Drugs: Tamoxifen, raloxifene, anastrozole, exemestane

Medications generally well tolerated taken for 5 years.

Tamoxifen is available for premenopausal women age 35 years and greater, carries risks of blood clots and endometrial cancer.

Tamoxifen, raloxifene, anastrozole, and exemestane are available for post-menopausal women: choice of medication by PATIENT counseling, based on acceptance of given side effect profiles (blood clots vs bone thinning).

All relevant professional and governmental advisory organizations (NCCN, ASCO, USPSTF) advise appropriate use of estrogen blockade for chemoprevention as an OPTION for appropriate patients, final DECISION by patient after appropriate counseling.
